AGREEMENT BETWEEN SHALER TOWNSHIP AND MILLVALE BOROUGH FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE SHALER AREA SCHOOL DISTRICT STREAM RESTORATION PROJECT WITHIN THE GIRTY'S RUN WATERSHED POLLUTANT REDUCTION PLAN.

THIS AGREEMENT is made this _____ day of _____, 2023, by Shaler Township and Millvale Borough for The Implementation of The Shaler Area School District Stream Restoration Project within the Girtys Run Watershed Pollutant Reduction Plan (“Agreement”) (collectively, the “Participants”) (each Participant shall individually be referred to as a “Party” and shall collectively be referred to as the “Parties”).

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the Shaler Township (hereinafter the Township) is a Township within the State of Pennsylvania seeking to improve the welfare of residents; and to comply with existing statutory requirements; and

WHEREAS, the Millvale Borough (hereinafter the Borough) is a Borough within the State of Pennsylvania seeking to improve the welfare of residents; and to comply with existing statutory requirements; and

WHEREAS, Both the Township and the Borough are required by law to fulfill their obligations under the Pollutant Reduction Plan (hereinafter PRP) associated with the 2018-2023 Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems permit (hereinafter MS4); and

WHEREAS, the Shaler Area School District Stream Restoration Project (hereinafter Project), which is located in Shaler Township and upstream of the Borough, is the individual best management practice to fulfill the Borough and the Township’s PRP phosphorus reduction requirement within the Girtys Run Watershed.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties to this agreement state the following:

1. Roles and Responsibilities
 - a. The Township selected the Project to fulfill the Township’s PRP phosphorus reduction requirement within the Girtys Run Watershed.
 - b. The Gateway Engineers, Inc. prepared and designed the project for the Township as illustrated in the concept within Attachment A.
 - c. The Township agrees to participate in full for the funding of construction and continuous Operation and Maintenance of the project in accordance with the Cost Sharing Provision provided herein.
 - d. The Township agrees to continue the Operation and Maintenance of the Project including all administrative and document related tasks in accordance with the Cost Sharing Provision provided herein.
 - e. The Township commits to utilizing the Project towards its PRP phosphorus reduction requirement within the Girtys Run Watershed in accordance with the Pollutant Reduction Sharing provided herein.

2. Cost Sharing

- a. The Township will pay 100% of the costs to implement and maintain the Shaler Area School District Stream Restoration Project. The Borough will reimburse the Township for 20% of engineering, construction, and maintenance of the Project.

3. Pollutant Reduction Sharing

- a. The Township will take approximately 80% (a minimum of 14.16 lbs/yr of phosphorus) of the PRP phosphorus reduction credit achieved from the Project. The Borough will take approximately 20% (a minimum of 4.20 lbs/yr of phosphorus) of the PRP phosphorus reduction credit achieved from the Project.

4. Implementation Schedule

- a. The Township agrees to construct the Project prior to March 15, 2024.
- b. If the Township is unable to complete the Project prior to March 15, 2024, this Agreement is null and void.

The Effective Date of this Agreement shall be _____ day of _____, 2023. It is recognized that the Township and Borough have executed this Agreement. It is the intent of both parties that their cooperative efforts shall commence as of the Effective Date.

IN WITNESS THEREOF, the parties hereto have hereunto set their hands and seals, with the intent to be legally bound, on the date first above mentioned.
